	robbery armed with a dangerous weapon and one	
	count of murder.	
19 May 2022	The jury returned verdicts of guilty to both	CAB 107

16 September	Sentence was imposed in the Supreme Court of	CAB 108
2022	New South Wales.	
11 September	The respondent's Notice of Appeal was filed in	CAB 143
